ROUTE OUTLINE

START Friday 14 SEP 2011. Saturday 15 SEP. Documentation and scrutineering at Glenkinchie distillery, charmingly set in the countryside near Edinburgh. Buffet lunch and distillery tour available. Welcome dinner and overnight in Edinburgh.


Sunday 16 SEP. Laystide and Tummel. After the traditional early start at Edinburgh Castle, Scotland's most important historic building, there's a lap consistency test at Knockhill racing circuit. Tests and regularity sections follow thick and fast as the rally visits a succession of great historic houses, interspersed with fine loch and mountain scenery. Tea at Dalwhinnie distillery; overnight at Aviemore.

Monday 17 SEP. Deeside and Speyside. Across high, bare Cairngorm roads to Balmoral and Royal Lochnagar distillery; then through the fertile rolling hills of Aberdeenshire to controls and tests at Haddo House and Fyvie Castle. Lunch at a quayside pub at picturesque Portsoy is followed by a journey through Scotland's main whisky producing region of Speyside, with tests at several distilleries, including Cragganmore. Return to Aviemore for the night.

Tuesday 18 SEP. The Road to the Isles. The famous Loch Ness Monster regularity section kicks the day off. As we head for the glorious coast of Wester Ross, and the challenging Pass of the Cattle, before crossing the modern bridge to Skye and a final test at Talisker distillery.

Wednesday 19 SEP. As in previous years, a rest day at Talisker full of entertaining activities - or you can just relax if you prefer. In the evening, there's the famous Talisker ceilidh, or traditional Gaelic party, with buffet supper, and the chance to sample plenty of whisky before the coach takes you back to your hotel.









Thursday 20 SEP. Moydart and Morvern. The rally is split up into different times of 50, starting at different times, to take successive ferries across to Mallaig and a scenic tour, with fewer competitive elements, of a remote and beautiful (and seldom rallied) part of Scotland, before taking another ferry to overnight in scattered accommodation on the Isle of Mull.



Friday 21 SEP. Mull and Iona. Another short and fairly relaxed day on Mull, a scenic island famous for its closed-road rally. After a long regularity section around the west coast, there's a three-hour halt to allow everyone to take the passenger ferry across to Iona, the island of the Celtic saints, to the Maclean stronghold of Duart Castle, to await the ferry to Oban, where most crews will overnight.

Saturday 22 SEP. Loch Awe, Loch Fyne and Loch Lomond. From Oban distillery, the route takes a scenic road past Loch Awe to Inveraray Castle and a test on the famous hillclimb at Rest and Be Thankful. There are more great tests and regularity sections as the rally leads eastwards to its finish near Edinburgh. Our sponsors Classic Malts of Scotland promise another unforgettable last evening.
